

Household Hazardous Products Checklist

Be careful! Make sure products are sealed. Pack them in a sturdy crate or cardboard box. Leave in your car only as long as necessary, and never smoke while handling.

In the Kitchen and Bathroom:

- Non-empty aerosol cans
- Household batteries
- Furniture, floor & metal polishes
- Bleach & spot removers
- Oven, drain & household cleaners
- Disinfectants & mildew removers
- CFL & fluorescent bulbs. LEDs
- Ammonia

In the Garage and Garden:

- Paint, varnishes, shellac, stains, thinners & paint strippers
- Pool and photographic chemicals
- Lawn care chemicals such as pesticides & fertilizers
- Auto fluids such as motor oil \mathcal{G} antifreeze
- Car waxes and cleaners
- Kerosene & fuel oil

Miscellaneous:

- Mercury (including thermometers and thermostats,
- Waste fuel, moth balls, hobby supplies
- Charcoal lighter fluid



When Using Household **Hazardous Products...**

Check the label.

If the product you are using is toxic, corrosive, hazardous to you and our environment. reactive, explosive or flammable it can be

- NEVER throw leftover chemicals down or in the trash. the drain, in stormdrains, on the ground
- Give leftover or extra product to somecollection day. one who can use it or bring it to a HHW
- designated collection site. Recycle used motor oil at your town's
- Y Recycle lead-acid car batteries by or battery retailer. bringing them to a scrap metal dealer
- Buy only what you need use all of what you buy.
- Use non-toxic or less toxic substitutes for hazardous products.
